In the recent film, *The Simpsons Movie*, Homer Simpson is saved by an Inuit shaman. She leads him in ritual chanting and dancing. "How long are we doing this?" Homer asks. "Until you have an epiphany," comes the reply. More chanting. "What's an epiphany?" Homer wonders. "Sudden realization of great truth," she answers. Under pressure, Homer tries hard. "Epiphany, epiphany, epiphany," he mutters, "Ooh! Bananas are an excellent source of potassium... Americans will never embrace soccer..."

Poor Homer. At times we may feel a kinship with his plight, as we try desperately to discover some deeper meaning. In our fast paced world it is difficult to take time to open ourselves up to the ways God is present.

Our worship allows us space to seek God. In the seasons of the church year, Epiphany is the time in which we reflect on God's revelation to us in Christ. January 6th, as the Twelfth Day of Christmas is the traditional day of Epiphany.

FCC Creates Prayer Journal for Army Chaplain and Troops

With the words of our new guiding vision statement as inspiration, in January we will be creating a prayer journal for peace and hope to send to military personnel serving overseas. Individuals may write prayers, poems, favorite lines of Scripture, greetings or drawings that reflect prayers for peace and well-being for military servicemen and women.

The prayers will be collected into one prayer journal which will be sent to U.S. Army Major Steven George, a Disciples of Christ chaplain who will be serving with troops in Afghanistan. Major George grew up in Bremerton, WA, and most recently has been stationed at Fort Lewis. In early 2008 Major George will travel with his Fort Hood, Texas unit to serve in Afghanistan.

Chapman University Concert Choir

The highly acclaimed 118-member Chapman University Choir will perform at Tacoma First Christian Church on **Sunday, January 6th at 7 pm**. The choir has performed in Europe, Asia and the U.S. Recent concert highlights include performing the Berlioz "Requiem" at the Sydney Opera House as well as the west coast premiere of Howard Shore's epic "The Lord of the Rings Symphony" with the Hollywood Bowl Orchestra. The choir has been featured on film soundtracks and can be seen in the movie *Sister Act II*. In May 2008 the choir will travel to Italy and as part of their tour will sing High Mass at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.

Chapman is a Disciples of Christ-affiliated university in CA. Originally founded as Hesperian College in 1861, it offered educational opportunities for men and women of all races, and today has a student body of 5,700.
